## THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

The month of November is a special month that is dedicated for the remembrance of our faithful departed. This past week, I read a book by a priest called Fr. Walter Ciseck. In the book he tells a story how Russian peasants remember their beloved departed each year. Families flock to the cemeteries as they do for a joyful picnic in the park. "The graves are cleansed and decorated and then families sit down to a meal at the graveside. Passers-by are invited to join the meal or toast." The peasants are utterly convinced that death is not the end of life; rather it is a doorway to eternal life.

The Russian peasants are right in believing that death is not the end but the beginning of eternal life, that it is the human spirit's glad release, that it is passing from pain to perfect peace and that it is like the parting of the cloud which reveals the sun. But Catholic faith adds something more about the beloved departed. It teaches that there is an in-between state of purification through which souls of the just pass before finally entering into eternal life. And this in-between state of purification is called Purgatory.

The first reason for believing in Purgatory is that the vast majority of people who die should not be judged so bad as to deserve hell, nor so good so as to deserve heaven. So there must be a kind of middle state where some sort of cleansing takes place. God is holy and his holiness is not just an attribute but it is his very essence. Hence, it stands to reason that souls must be perfectly purified before entering into the presence of such a holy God. The soul in purgatory may be compared to a freshly cut diamond; it is truly one of God's beautiful creatures. But it is far from being perfect. Therefore the divine artisan brings it to its full potential by polishing it that is, purifying it.

The second reason for believing in Purgatory is today's understanding of salvation, won for us by Jesus Christ through his death on the cross. Salvation is not understood as a single dramatic act of God. It is rather an ongoing process that continues to unfold as one's relationship with God develops. One can't say "I was saved at 2 pm yesterday afternoon." Rather, we affirm that we are being saved as we live the Christian life and God continues to touch us. This means we are continuously being purified from sin and its effect, becoming more and more holy. Therefore, the process of our being saved does not stop instantaneously the moment we die. It continues during our journey into eternal life. As such, we also must believe that the saving process also continues in the state called Purgatory.

The third reason for believing in the in-between state of purification called Purgatory is our belief in the "Communion of Saints". According to this belief, the person who dies remains in touch with his or her fellow Christians who are still living and remain in a prayerful intercessory role with them. Hence, the beloved departed are still active in the whole salvation process. If this is so, we must also believe that they continue to be actively purged and are made more and more Godlike before they finally enter into heaven.

With this understanding of purgatory as an in-between the state of purification, our prayers for the beloved departed make sense. Our prayers assist in their purification to become Saints. Our prayers also remind us that we, the living, are part of one communion, the communion of Saints. We are confident that in the all-seeing mind of God, our prayers aid in the perfect purification of the beloved departed. It is in this family a sense of continued relationship with the beloved departed that Cardinal Newman wrote this final Line of *The Dream of Gerontius*: "Farewell but not forever, brother dear! Be brave and patient on the bed of sorrow; Swiftly shall pass thy night of trial here, And I shall come and wake thee on the Morrow!"

Let this month be a month of prayer in memory of all our dear ones who have gone before us.




