

FOR GOD'S SAKE, DO NOT DO THE JUDAS SHUFFLE: PART FOUR

In this week's article, we are going to comment on the liturgical commandments 4 and 5 which say:

- 4. Please, plan always to arrive for Mass on time and if for justifiable reason you arrive while the readings are going on, please stay at the back of the church until the time of the Gospel acclamation before you find a space to sit.
- 5. Do not do the Judas shuffle! Mass is not over until we receive the final blessing and the priest and deacons process to the foyer.

Have you ever been late for Mass or have you ever left early? I guess the answer is yes for most of us. These are the questions this article is trying to address.

If we reflect carefully and honestly, we will admit that for things or events that matter most to us, we spend considerable amount of time planning for them. The greater the interest or event, the more meticulous we are in our planning process. This is what I would like to consider coming to Mass to involve. Truly, if going to Mass is a priority and that important to us, as it should, it must involve more pre-planning and organization. In planning for this great event, we should be laying our clothes out and all the things we shall use, the night before, or getting up an hour earlier to prepare; always thinking of everything that could possibly go wrong and planning for it. This will greatly minimize the occasions of being late. This is because when we come for Mass we come to personally encounter Christ who is truly present: body, spirit, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. What can be more important than that?

As for leaving Mass early for whatever reason or for reasons like traffic, we must trust that if we give him time, the Lord will always take care of that and our other concerns. If we are, for instance, stuck in traffic, we could use that time to reflect more on the homily by asking questions and sharing the meaning of one of the symbols used at mass or even listen to our Catholic Radio. Most of all, we could use this time in thanksgiving for the most perfect gift of all, Jesus Christ whom we have just received. Now, if you don't like the traffic, then plan to stay an extra fifteen minutes after mass and reach out to just one individual you don't know. If you do this each week, by the end of the year you would have made fifty-two new friends. For, are we not known to be a warm and welcoming parish? Alternatively, you could also plan to come fifteen minutes early or stay fifteen minutes late and pray the rosary for your family and your community. Believe me, this spiritual exercise will increase your sensitivity to who is really present during the liturgy, Christ whom you have just received.

Leaving Mass early, before the final blessing therefore, is like longing to be with and spend some special time with someone we love, who then comes only to tell you they couldn't stay because they had other more important commitments. How would we feel? Similarly, when we come for Mass, Christ is longing 'desperately' to spend that quality time with you at least for an hour — "Could you not keep watch with me for an hour...." (Mt. 26:40) So, by leaving early, we betray and offend Him, not your pastor or the priest officiating at the Mass. Remember that we priests are only physical representatives of Christ in the sacraments. Jesus is the real High Priest and the Victim officiating at the Mass. That is why every Mass is very special and very healing. Each time we go through the entire liturgy, it leads us through repentance, instruction, encouragement and communion with the one Lord who can dispel all darkness, forgive us our sins, heal and strengthen us to go forth and evangelize. By leaving Mass early, we miss out on all of these! Think about it!

POR EL AMOR DE DIOS NO HAGAN LO QUE HIZO JUDAS: CUARTA PARTE

En el artículo de esta semana, hablamos de el 4 y 5 mandamientos liturgicos que dicen:

- 4. Por favor de planear en llegar a Misa a tiempo, si por una razón válida llegan durante las primeras lecturas por favor de quedarse parado atrás de la iglesia hasta que se comienze a leer el Evangelio y entonces puede encontrar cupo.
- 5. No salgan de Misa antes de que se acabe completamente, como lo hizo Judas en la primera Misa. La Misa no se acaba antes de las bendiciones finales y cuando esten los Padres y Diáconos en el pasillo de la entrada de la iglesia.

Ha habido vez que ha llegado tarde a Misa o sale temprano? Me imagino que la respuesta es "sí" de casí todos. Estas son las preguntas que abordaré en este artículo.

Si reflexionamos honesta y cuidadosamente, tendremos que admitir que para las cosas que nosotros consideramos importante nos damos bastante tiempo en hacer arreglos. Lo más grande el evento o interés, lo más que meticulosamente hacemos esos planes. Esto es lo que me gustaría considerar en planear a venir a Misa. Verdaderamente, si ir a Misa fuera una prioridad y tán importante para nosotros, como debe que ser, debe que tener más intento en planear y organizar. En planear para este gran evento, debemos que arreglar la ropa la noche anterior y todo lo demás que vamos a necesitar o tendremos que levantarnos una hora más temprano para estar bien preparados. También tenemos que pensar en las cosas que pueden ir mal y hacer planes para sobre pasar esas situaciones. Poniendo a mano estas recomendaciones pueden evitar el llegar tarde a Misa. Esto es que cuando venimos a Misa, venimos a tener un encuentro personal con Cristo, quien está verdaderamente presente en cuerpo, sangre, alma, y divinidad en la Eucaristía. ¿Qué puede ser más importante que ésto?

En cuestion de salir de Misa temprano por cualquier razón, sea tráfico u otras razones, tenemos que tener confianza que si le damos tiempo a Dios, Él se hace cargo de todo eso y de nuestras otras preocupaciones. Si por ejemplo estamos atrapados en tráfico podemos usas ese tiempo para reflexionar más profundamente sobre la homilía. También podemos usar ese tiempo en conversaciones sobre los símbolos usados en Misa o para oír una estación católica en la radio. Más que nada, podemos usar este tiempo para darle gracias a Dios por su regalo perfecto que apenas hemos recibido, Jesucristo. Ahora, si no le gusta el tráfico, entonces pásese unos extra 15 minutos después de Misa en oración o en conocer a alguien nuevo. Si hace esto cada semana para el fín del año tendra 52 amigos nuevos. ¿Apoco no se sabe que St. James es una comunidad muy acogedora? Alternativamente, también puede llegar 15 minutos antes y rezar el rosario con su familia y su comunidad. Créanme, esta devoción espiritual les dará a saber quien realmente esta presente durante la Misa: Cristo, quien apenas usted ha recibido.

Al salir de Misa temprano antes de las bendiciones finales es como anhelar pasar tiempo especial con alguien que queremos mucho y entonces que esa persona nos diga que no porque tiene unas cosas más importantes que hacer. ¿Cómo nos sintiéramos? Semejantemente, cuando venimos a Misa, Cristo anhela desesperadamente pasar tiempo especial con cada uno de nosotros siquiera por una hora---¿Así que no habéis podido velar conmigo una hora? (Mateo 26:40) Entonces, al salir temprano de Misa, nosotros traicionamos y ofendemos al Señor, no al párraco o el sacerdote oficiando la Misa. Acuérdense, que los sacerdotes solamente son representates físicos de Cristo en los Sacramentos. Esa es la razón que cada Misa es muy especial y sanadora. Cada vez que celebramos la liturgía completa nos lleva al arrepentimiento, nos enseña, nos fortalice, y experimentamos comunión con el Señor quien sacude la oscuridad, nos perdona nuestros pecados, nos sana y nos da la fortaleza para salir y evangelizer. !Al salir de Misa temprano nos perdemos todo esto! !Piénselo!
