FOR GOD'S SAKE, DO NOT DO THE JUDAS SHUFFLE!

We are very fortunate to have a God who loves us so much and so unconditionally that He is ever at our service twenty four hours a day seven days a week. He is so in love with us that no detail of our welfare escapes His ever loving attention. As I pointed out in my article two weeks ago, He has a way of intervening in our lives in very difficult situations and in very unlikely ways especially in moments when we feel all is lost. Unfortunately, many times we tend to forget Him as soon as He gets us out of our difficulties. Yes, we then put other priorities before Him! And, when we come to Church, we think we are doing Him a favor by clocking in and clocking out as soon as possible!

As true followers of Christ and as Catholics, we believe that there is no greater encounter we can have with our God than in the Eucharist which is the center, summit and heart of our Church, our faith and of our St. James parish. Ultimately, we experience this encounter at the celebration of the Mass which we are fortunate to have daily or at least on weekends here at our parish. This is the one celebration that summons us the way we are in our brokenness; as sinners and saints alike to form one body, the body of Christ. It is the one celebration to which no entry tickets, and no advance bookings are required despite the priceless gift we are invited to receive. This alone should be reason enough to have our churches filled to capacity every Sunday with only standing room and with members striving to arrive early enough to find sitting space.

Sadly however, we rarely see this happening in our churches, instead we frequently witness members not only coming to church very late but also doing the Judas shuffle! For those who do not know, the Judas shuffle is the act of leaving Mass early, typically between receiving communion and the concluding rite, without a justifiable reason for doing so. This expression has its origin in the infamous act of Judas Iscariot who at the Last Supper left Jesus and the apostles celebrating the first Mass, to go and execute the betrayal of his Master. In so doing he not only missed the last blessing of our Lord but also exposed himself to the treachery of betrayal! When you leave Mass before receiving the final blessing for flimsy reasons such as catching up with lunch appointments or watching the World Cup, remember that you are not only committing sin but also missing on the final blessing as Judas did.

So, for God's sake, do not ever do the Judas shuffle! To Give the Eucharistic (Mass) celebration the importance it deserves, I would like you to observe the following commandments:

1. Do not receive calls or send text messages in Church. These should never take God's time!
2. Ensure that your cell phones and all other electronic devices are switched off before entering the Church.
3. Maintain reverent silence while in the Church. Remember you are in the house of God and therefore, should show respect and allow others who want to pray before and after the Mass to do so in silence. You can interact and talk as much as you want in the courtyard.
4. Please, plan always to arrive for Mass on time and if for justifiable reason you arrive while the readings are going on, please stay at the back of the church till the time of the Gospel acclamation before you find a space to sit.
5. Do not do the Judas shuffle! Mass is not over until we receive the final blessing and the priest and deacons process to the foyer.
6. Dress modestly and appropriately showing a Christian respect for others. The Arizona summer heat should never be an excuse for doing otherwise!
7. Do not chew gum, drink coffee or soda in the Church.
8. Do not step on the kneelers or drop them down roughly and loudly before kneeling.
9. Before leaving Church, please, look around your seat and leave your environment clean.
10. Come to Church early and leave only after the final blessing!

By following these 10 liturgical commandments, we shall not only give God the respect due to Him but also enjoy His abundant blessings. St. James, the choice is yours!



¡POR EL AMOR DE DIOS, NO HUYAN COMO JUDAS!

Somos muy afortunados de tener un Dios que nos ama tanto y de manera incondicional que Él está siempre a nuestro servicio las veinticuatro horas del día, siete días a la semana. Él está tan enamorado de nosotros que ninguno de nuestros defectos se da a ver ante él. Como señalé en mi artículo de hace dos semanas, Él tiene una manera de intervenir en nuestras vidas en situaciones muy difíciles, especialmente en momentos en los que sentimos que todo está perdido. Desafortunadamente, muchas veces tendemos a olvidarlo tan pronto como Él nos saca de nuestras tribulaciones. Sí, y luego ponemos otras prioridades antes que él. ¡Y, cuando venimos a la Iglesia, creemos que le estamos haciendo un favor al entrar y salir lo mas antes posible!

Como verdaderos seguidores de Cristo y como católicos, creemos que no hay mejor encuentro que podamos tener con nuestro Dios, que en la Eucaristía: la cumbre, el centro de nuestra Iglesia, nuestra fe y de nuestra parroquia de San James. En última instancia, experimentamos este encuentro en la celebración de la Misa que tenemos la suerte de tener todos los días o por lo menos los fines de semana aquí en nuestra parroquia. Esta es la celebración que nos convoca a reunirnos con nuestros quebrantos como pecadores y santos para formar un solo cuerpo: el cuerpo de Cristo. Es la celebración a la que no se requieren boletos de entrada, y no hay reservas anticipadas a pesar del inestimable don que se nos invita a recibir. Esto por sí solo debería ser razón suficiente para que nuestras iglesias estén a reventar todos los domingos y lleguen temprano para encontrar su asiento.

Tristemente, sin embargo, rara vez vemos que esto ocurre en nuestras Iglesias. En cambio, con frecuencia, como feligreses, no sólo vienen a la iglesia tarde pero también huyen como Judas. Para aquellos que no saben, el huir como Judas es el hecho de irse temprano de la misa, normalmente entre la comunión y antes de recibir la bendición final, sin una razón justificada. Esta expresión tiene su origen en el acto infame de Judas Iscariote, que en la Última Cena dejó a Jesús y a los apóstoles celebrando la primera misa, para ir y ejecutar la traición de su amo. ¡Al hacerlo, no sólo se perdió la última bendición de nuestro Señor, pero también se expuso a la traición de la traición! Así que, antes de salir de misa y antes de la bendición final, por razones endeble, como para irse a almorzar o para ver la Copa Mundial o porque están aburridos, recuerden que no sólo están cometiendo un pecado, sino que también cometen la falta de no recibir la bendición final como lo hizo Judas.

Entonces, por el amor de Dios, ¡no vuelvan a huir como Judas! Para darle a la celebración de la misa su importancia que se merece, me gustaría que ustedes observen y practiquen los siguientes mandamientos:

1. No reciba llamadas o envíe mensajes de texto durante la misa ni en la Iglesia. ¡Estos nunca deben tomar el tiempo de Dios!
2. Asegúrese de que los teléfonos celulares y todo aparato electrónico estén apagados y olvidados en su bolso antes de entrar a la Iglesia.
3. Mantener silencio y reverencia mientras que este en la Iglesia. Recuerden que están en la casa de Dios y por lo tanto, deben mostrar respeto y permitir a otros que quieran rezar antes y después de la Misa de hacerlo en silencio. Pueden interactuar y hablar todo lo que quieran en el patio (afuera).
4. Por favor, planee siempre llegar a misa a tiempo y si por causa justificada llegan tarde, mientras que las lecturas estén siendo leídas, por favor permanezca en la parte de atrás de la iglesia hasta el momento de la aclamación del Evangelio, antes de encontrar su asiento.
5. ¡No huyan como Judas! La Misa no ha terminado hasta que reciban la bendición final y el sacerdote y diácono hagan la procesión final.
6. Vistan modestamente y muestren respeto cristiano hacia los demás. ¡El calor del verano de Arizona nunca debe ser una excusa para hacer lo contrario!
7. No mastique chicle, no tome café ni un refresco adentro en la Iglesia
8. No pise los reclinatorios ni los deje caer fuerte antes de arrodillarse.
9. Antes de salir de la iglesia, por favor, mire a su alrededor y deje su lugar limpio.
10. ¡Vengan a la iglesia temprano y recuerden que deben salir sólo después de la bendición final!

Siguiendo estos 10 mandamientos litúrgicos, no sólo daremos a Dios el respeto que se le debe, sino que también disfrutaran de sus abundantes bendiciones. ¡San James, tu elijes!

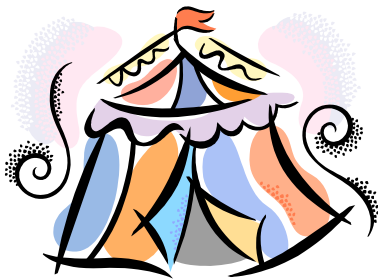

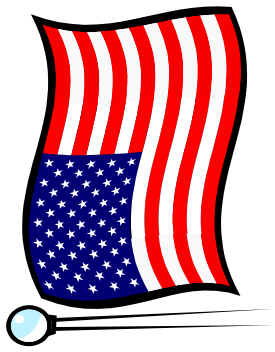
