

### WHAT THE SYNOD FATHERS SAID AT THE SYNOD ON FAMILY

Last Sunday ended a two-week gathering of the Catholic Bishops in Rome, called by Pope Francis, to discuss issues and challenges affecting families in our modern world. The two weeks saw a lot of intense discussions on various aspects of family, culminating in voting on what should be included in the final document. What did they come out with?

In brief, the final document of this gathering, referred to as <u>Extraordinary Synod</u>, was released on Saturday as the Synod Fathers voted to approve all 62 paragraphs. However, three paragraphs did not receive the normally required two-thirds majority vote and would normally not have been included in the final synod report, but they were. These include: 1) permitting certain remarried divorced Catholics to receive communion after a period of penitence, 2) invoking a deeper call to understanding of the issue of spiritual communion for the divorced and remarried and 3) receiving homosexuals "with respect and gentleness." However, the document has removed the much-criticized language that spoke of "valuing" the homosexual orientation.

With obvious input from cardinals who objected strenuously to the midterm report, and insisted on the publications of the summaries of the ten working groups, the final document contains several very positive developments.

It notes for instance that "Openness to life is an intrinsic requirement of conjugal love." And in that context promotes natural fertility regulation. It also urges a rediscovery of the encyclical Humanae Vitae.

The final document or Relatio Synodi addresses parents' freedom to "choose the kind of education to be given to children according to their beliefs." It notes that the Church plays a supportive role to parents in the education of their children, especially in faith.

Some of the language criticized as ambiguous by Synod Fathers in the original Relatio, including the use of the term "gay" and that spoke of unqualifiedly "welcoming" homosexuals while "valuing" their orientation, is no longer present. Rather the document speaks of the "pastoral care" for "people with homosexual orientation."

While the document stresses accepting persons with homosexual tendencies and avoiding "every sign of unjust discrimination," it says clearly "There are absolutely no grounds for considering homosexual unions to be in any way similar or even remotely analogous to God's plan for marriage and family."

Moreover, the Relatio Synodi calls it "totally unacceptable" that some pastors of the Church suffer pressure from international bodies who make financial aid to poor countries conditional upon the acceptance of "marriage" between persons of the same sex."

The document notes that the Church recognizes the family as the basic cell of human society.

It quotes at length Jesus' words reaffirming the "indissoluble union between a man and a woman" in marriage. It recalls the approach of Christ to sinners, to approach them with love, but always to lead them to repentance and conversion.

Nevertheless, although the proposal is contentious among the Fathers, it calls for easing of the process of annulment, and consideration for communion for Catholics remarried after divorce in restricted circumstances.

The extraordinary synod opens further discussion on these issues for the next year both in the various episcopal conferences around the world and in other fora. Let us continue to pray for a fruitful outcome of all these efforts.

### LO QUE FUE DISCUTIDO EN EL SINODO SOBRE LA FAMILIA

El Domingo pasado fue la conclusión del sínodo que fue llamado por el Papa Francisco para hablar sobre los desafíos y temas afectando las familias de hoy en día. En estas últimas dos semanas hubo muchas discusiones intensas sobre los diferentes aspectos de la familia culminando con votación sobre lo que debe ser incluido en el document final. ¿Qué fue en lo que quedaron de acuerdo?

El documento final del Sínodo Extraordinario fue publicado el Sábado siguiente la aprobación de los Padres del Sínodo. En total se aprobaron 62 párrafos. Sinembargo, tres párrafos fueron incluidos que no tuvieron el requisito normal de la mayoría de dos tercios. Estos incluyen: 1) permitir en ciertos casos que personas divorciadas tomen comunión después de un periodo de penitencia 2) invocación de un entendimiento más profundo sobre la comunión espíritual para Católicos divorciados y casados otra vez y 3) el tener que recibir a personas homosexuals con "respecto y amabilidad." Sinembargo, el document ha removido el lenguage muy críticado que hablo sobre "valorando" la orientación homosexual.

Con la contribución obvia de los cardenales quienes enérgicamente objetaron el reporte a medio del sínodo y que insistieron que se publicaran los resumenes de los diez grupos, el documento final contiene varios desarrollos positivos.

El reporte dice por ejemplo que "el amor conyugal por requisito intrinsico tiene que estar abierto a la vida" y que en ese contexto promueve regulación de la fertilidad. También propone el mejor conocimiento del encíclico *Humane Vitae*.

El document final o *Relatio Synodi* trata la de libertad de padres de familia de poder elegir la clase de educación que se les dará a sus hijos en acuerdo con sus creencias. Destaca que la Iglesia tome un rol de apoyo a los padres de familia en la educación de sus hijos, especialmente referente a la fe.

Porciones del lenguage utilizado por los Padres del Sínodo fue criticado por ser ambiguo en el *Relatio* original, incluyendo el término "gay" y que habló de "bienvenir" a los homosexuals mientras "valorando" su orientación, ya no está presente en el documento. En vez el documento habla del "cuidado pastoral" para "personas con orientación homosexual".

Mientras que el documento estresa la acceptcion del personas con tendencias homosexuals y evitar "cada seña de descriminación injusta", claramente dice "No hay ningun motivo para considerar una unión homosexual semejante en cualquier modo a el plan de Dios para un matrimonio y familia."

Además, el *Relatio Synodi* le llama la presión que unas organizaciones internacionales, que dan ayuda financiera a paises pobres, les ponen a unos párrocos de la Iglesia para que accepten "matrimonio" entre personas del mismo sexo. Estas organizaciones hacen su apoyo fianciero condicional a que esos párrocos accepten esos "matrimonios".

El documento nota que la Iglesia reconoce la familia como la célula básica de la sociedad humana.

Cita a largo las palabras de Jesús afirmando la "indissoluble unión entre un hombre y una mujer" en el matrimonio. El documento también nos recuerda de la actitud de Cristo a pecadores, de tratarlos con amor, pero siempre llevarlos al arrepentimiento y conversion.

Sinembargo, la propuesta es conflictive entre los Padres, llama a un relajamiento del proceso de anulación, y consideración para comunión para Católicos re-casados después de un divorcio en circunstancias restringidas.

El sínodo extraordinario abre más discusiones sobre estos temas para el año que viene en varias conferencias episcopales y otros grupos alrededor del mundo. Sigamos orando por un resultado fructuoso de todos estos esfuerzos.

**Dress Code:** No Levis and no Tee Shirts, please.




