FAMILY FORMATION NEWS



Thank you to those families who joined us on Tuesday and Wednesday night. It was wonderful to see you all again!

Home lesson packets for the month of May are ready for pick up in the office .

This month's theme is Mary.

SVdP Today as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension we are reminded that Christ's saving work on earth continues through his disciples...and now through us.

When we give to the poor, God indeed pours his love, peace and joy into our hearts, into our lives and into the hearts of those who are poor.

This week our pantry needs jelly and canned chili. We are asking you to consider donating to SVdP at St. James through the Arizona Charitable Tax Credit, single persons can donate up to \$400 and married couples can donate up to \$800. This year the code 20540 must be noted on your State tax return Form 321, due to the extension of the tax deadline donations now need to be made **prior to 5/17/21.**

JOSEPH: SELFLESS AND LOVING FATHER

Saint Joseph was selfless. In St. Joseph we see a man who selflessly dedicated himself to serving and protecting Mary and Jesus. He understood that everything was not about himself and his profile, but he was the faithful steward whose duty as a father was to be wholly present for those entrusted to him. His entire life was a manifestation of selfless love. His devotion to his family is a model of fathers today who may be allowing disorder attachments to the things of this world to distort their focus and hinder their vocation.

This calls for transformation from “*man-love*” which many times seems superficial, to a “*fathers-love*” which involves a sacrifice of self for others. It is true that many men are the bread earners for their families, but real fathers never sacrifice their families for their jobs. The prolonged or permanent absence of fathers from their families can cause “*father hunger*” for many. Fr. Richard Rohr (*From Wild Man to Wise Man*, 2005) expresses this tragic fact succinctly: *Father hunger is a great gaping wound that many carry, without realizing it or, at least, without being able to name it. It is a deprivation many are trying to overcome, a need that they are always seeking to satisfy.*

The many “over-mothered” children need healing through the presence of father figures who are strong enough to offer them a shoulder to lean on and set limits to the often-wild freedom. Our Bishop Thomas in “*Into the Breach*” reflected on this as he says, “All men are called to fatherhood.” He continued to say, “Today's attack on fatherhood, and by extension, motherhood, is multi prolonged and breathtakingly damaging. 41% are born into unmarried homes in our day, an increase of 700% from 1950, when the out-of-wedlock birth rate was mere 6%”.

In his apostolic letter, *Patris Corde* (With the Father's Heart), Pope Francis points to a fatherhood crisis which is a result of many men absconding from their responsibility to care for the children. These are, thus, many orphans with living parents who are not doing their job.

Bishop Thomas continues to say, the children are not fatherless because of some sweeping physical conflict like World War II, which caused many rounds of fatherlessness, but rather and far worse, fathers' deliberate absences are occurring on a massive scale... the child is forced to ask question: “Where is my Daddy?” What is in the heart of a child, is the heart of his or her understanding of the world.

JOSÉ: PADRE AMOROSO Y DESINTERESADO

San José fue desinteresado. En San José vemos a un hombre que se dedicó desinteresadamente a servir y proteger a María y Jesús. Comprendió que no todo se trataba de sí mismo y de su perfil, sino que era el fiel mayordomo cuyo deber como padre era estar plenamente presente para los que le eran confiados. Toda su vida fue una manifestación de amor desinteresado. Su devoción por su familia es un modelo de los padres de hoy que pueden estar permitiendo que los apegos del desorden a las cosas de este mundo distorsionen su enfoque y obstaculicen su vocación.

Esto exige la transformación del "amor de hombre", que muchas veces parece superficial, a un "amor de padre" que implica el sacrificio de uno mismo por los demás. Es cierto que muchos hombres son los que ganan el sustento de sus familias, pero los verdaderos padres nunca sacrifican a sus familias por sus trabajos. La ausencia prolongada o permanente de los padres de sus familias puede causar "hambre de padre" para muchos. P. Richard Rohr (From Wild Man to Wise Man, 2005) expresa suvitamente este trágico hecho: El hambre del padre es una gran herida abierta que muchos llevan, sin darse cuenta o, al menos, sin poder nombrarla. Es una privación que muchos están tratando de superar, una necesidad que siempre buscan satisfacer.

Los muchos niños "sobrematernos" necesitan ser sanados a través de la presencia de figuras paternas que son lo suficientemente fuertes como para ofrecerles un hombro en el que apoyarse y poner límites a la libertad a menudo salvaje. Nuestro obispo Thomas en "Into the Breach" reflexionó sobre esto como él dice, "Todos los hombres están llamados a la paternidad". Continuó diciendo: "El ataque actual a la paternidad y, por extensión, a la maternidad, es prolongado e increíblemente dañino. El 41% nace en hogares de solteros en nuestros días, un aumento del 700% desde 1950, cuando el matrimonio la tasa de natalidad era apenas del 6%".

En su carta apostólica *Patris Corde* (Con el corazón del padre), el Papa Francisco señala una crisis de paternidad que es el resultado de muchos hombres que se fugan de su responsabilidad de cuidar a los niños. Se trata, pues, de muchos huérfanos con padres vivos que no están haciendo su trabajo.

Nuestro obispo Thomas Olmsted continúa diciendo, los niños no son huérfanos de padre debido a un conflicto físico generalizado como la Segunda Guerra Mundial, que causó muchas rondas de huérfanos de padre, pero más bien, y mucho peor, las ausencias deliberadas de los padres están ocurriendo en una escala masiva ... el niño es forzado para hacer la pregunta: "¿Dónde está mi papá?" Lo que hay en el corazón de un niño es el corazón de su comprensión del mundo.

Monday, May 17, 2021**EASTER WEEKDAY****Solitude and solidarity**

Many have experienced more solitude than they care for during the pandemic, but it'd be a shame to lose the lessons of the experience once it's over. Catholics have a strong tradition of finding the sacred in solitude. The monastic life, for example, is all about withdrawing from society to draw closer to God and ultimately to each other. Turning inward is an opportunity for growth. Ritualizing the routines of life—in the midst of grief and stress and fear—helps to maintain inner stability and clarity. At the same time, far too many haven't had the luxury of solitude to remove themselves from danger—let this fact light a fire in all of us to fight for justice for those who have risked all to serve society this past year.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 19:1-8; John 16:29-33 (297). "I am not alone, because the Father is with me."*

Tuesday, May 18, 2021**MEMORIAL OF JOHN I, POPE, MARTYR****Define your terms**

In 2011, the Nicene Creed in English changed from the poetic-but-imprecise "one in being"—recited at Mass for more than 40 years—back to a seemingly unusual, clunky Latin word: *consubstantial*. We learned that *consubstantial* was a critical distinction hammered out at various church councils to clarify that Jesus was divinely co-eternal with God. It was a pronouncement specifically designed to refute the Arian heresy that denied Christ's divinity. The struggle against Arianism cost Pope John I his life in 526. Words matter. Take time to choose the right ones.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 20:17-27; John 17:1-11a (298). "Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began."*

Wednesday, May 19, 2021**EASTER WEEKDAY****Going home**

Final farewells are difficult. While there can be grace in the chance to express love and gratitude, there also can be great pain at the thought of never again seeing a face, touching a hand, hearing a voice. There is true heartache in accepting that there will be no more shared meals, meaningful discussions, shared futures planned together as we surrender the companionship of a loved one. It is a bittersweet time because the grief of anticipated loss is proof of an equally deep love. Yet it is not the end—faith promises us more. On this Easter Wednesday, with trust in the promise of new life, give thanks to God for someone whose love and faithfulness has enriched your life.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 20:28-38; John 17:11b-19 (299). "They were all weeping loudly . . . for they were deeply distressed that (Paul) had said that they would never see his face again."*

Thursday, May 20, 2021**MEMORIAL OF BERNARDINE OF SIENA, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS,****MISSIONARY****History will be our judge**

Church history is filled with admirable figures who stand out for their tender love and compassion. Bernardine of Siena was not that kind of saint. A fire-and-brimstone preacher with a moralizing temperament, he encouraged "bonfires of the vanities" where townsfolk pitched household items suggestive of luxury or leisure—mirrors, perfumes, games—into the fire. Seen from our vantage point, many of his sermons had antisemitic, misogynistic, and homophobic overtones. Though a commanding preacher who lived a life of devotion, Bernardine—like all of us—was a product of his times, limited by the pastoral and theological perspectives handed down to him. His innovations in vernacular preaching continue to inspire, yet his limitations in compassion and inclusion serve as a cautionary tale. None of us has a monopoly on moral purity. Kindness and compassion, however, never go out of style.

Friday, May 21, 2021**MEMORIAL OF CHRISTOPHER MAGALLANES, PRIEST, MARTYR, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS****Live fully**

Each of us is called to give our lives fully on behalf of our love for and commitment to God. Most of us will not die a martyr's death, but some of us will. Christopher Magallanes was one such person. Christopher's call to be a martyr was lived every day through his prayer and ministry as a priest: founding schools, providing work opportunities, and even constructing a dam to help the people. He was killed because of his love for the people, a love emanating from his deep faith. How does our faith inspire us to give of ourselves fully?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 25:13b-21; John 21:15-19 (301). " 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.' He said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' "*

Saturday, May 22, 2021**MEMORIAL OF RITA OF CASCIA, RELIGIOUS****Hope is a perennial**

We all could use a friend like Saint Rita of Cascia. Wed against her will at the tender age of 12, she somehow survived abuse and family feuds to become a reconciling force in a violent region of 15th-century Italy. She has acquired a following, along with Saint Jude, as the patron of hopeless causes. On her deathbed, it is said she asked for a rose from her garden. Though it was winter, we are told a single blooming rose was found and brought to her. Never lose hope—no cause is hopeless!

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 28:16-20, 30-31; John 21:20-25 (302). "There are also many other things that Jesus did."*


