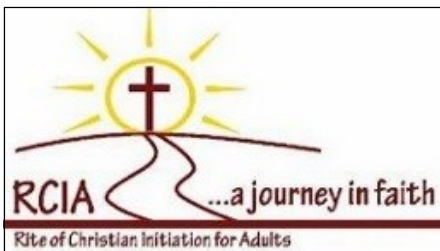

SUNDAY DIVINE MERCY

I have seen many families destroyed because of inability to forgive. I have seen people in our society who live in a state of depression because they were not able to forgive others. I have met elderly people who were caught in the past with contempt for mistakes they made when they were teenagers. They were unable to forgive themselves. There is no future without forgiveness. There is no future without accepting God's mercy that He offers to us and others. There is no peace of mind if we refuse to forgive other people, or themselves.

Today we celebrate the Feast of Mercy, above all we celebrate the Divine Mercy revealed to us in Bible and promoted to us by a Nun, St. Faustina who was born shortly before the World War II. Christ revealed Himself several times during her lifetime and to renew the Divine Mercy message to the world. I desire this Image with the signature "*Jesus I trust in You*" be venerated in your Chapel and throughout the world. **Jesus told her, "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish, and I also promise that. And I want this image to be blessed on the first Sunday after Easter. And this Sunday be called the Feast of Mercy. On that day the depth of my mercy will be open to all. My daughter encourages souls to pray the chaplet which I have given to you."**

Brothers and Sisters in Gospel of St. Luke Jesus said, "*Be merciful as your Father is.*" The Lord has given us a beautiful devotion of Divine Mercy to help us to be merciful toward others. *Mercy is a perfection of love.* What Jesus wants from us today is we decide in our hearts to love the same way he has loved us. His love goes beyond forgiving our sins and he became the sacrifice that took away our sins. Let us try to accept and love other people, beginning with our own family members and others. Let us make an effort to offer our mercy for them daily. We will be able to do that if we are able to sacrifice our ego and become an expression of the love of Jesus. His love for us is unconditional. How many times have we said, I will love you if you do this or that for me? I will forgive you if you behave this or the other way. Suffering is always involved in the manifestation of love. We cannot love others if we truly refuse to forgive them. We need to be prepared to accept others as they are. Sometimes people feel bad because they were hurt and therefore, they don't forgive. Let us remember that forgiveness is about lack of negative feelings. It is about a decision to forgive.

Perhaps we need to remember to give each other chance. How often do we have to forgive? *When Peter came to Jesus to ask, "Lord how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?" "Not seven I tell you but seventy-seven times" he meant always.* Is there any member of your community who is expecting you to forgive? Are there people in our families who are living a miserable life because we have chosen not to forgive them? Is there anyone within your reach who can be set free by your healing words, "I forgive you?" Let us pray for our willingness for our forgiveness for all those who hurt us.

DOMINGO DIVINA MISERICORDIA

He visto muchas familias destruidas por la incapacidad de perdonar. He visto personas en nuestra sociedad que viven en un estado de depresión porque no fueron capaces de perdonar a los demás. He conocido a personas mayores que en el pasado fueron atrapadas con desprecio por los errores que cometieron cuando eran adolescentes. Eran incapaces de perdonarse a sí mismos. No hay futuro sin perdón. No hay futuro sin aceptar la misericordia de Dios que nos ofrece a nosotros y a los demás. No hay paz mental si nos negamos a perdonar a otras personas o a nosotros mismos.

Hoy celebramos la Fiesta de la Misericordia, sobre todo celebramos la Divina Misericordia revelada a nosotros en la Biblia y promovida por una Monja, Santa Faustina que nació poco antes de la Segunda Guerra Mundial. Cristo se reveló varias veces durante su vida y para renovar el mensaje de la Divina Misericordia al mundo, deseó que esta Imagen con la firma "Jesús en Ti confío" sea venerada en tu capilla y en todo el mundo. Jesús le dijo: "Yo prometo que el alma que venere esta imagen no perecerá, y también lo prometo. Y quiero que esta imagen sea bendecida el primer domingo después de pascua. Y este domingo sea llamado Fiesta de la Misericordia. Ese día la profundidad de mi misericordia estará abierta para todos. Hija mía, anima a las almas a rezar la coronilla que te he dado".

Hermanos y hermanas en el Evangelio de San Lucas, Jesús dijo: "Sed misericordiosos como su Padre". El Señor nos ha dado una hermosa devoción de la Divina Misericordia para ayudarnos a ser misericordiosos con los demás. La misericordia es una perfección del amor. Lo que Jesús quiere de nosotros hoy es que decidamos en nuestro corazón amar de la misma manera que él nos ha amado. Su amor va más allá de perdonar nuestros pecados y se convirtió en el sacrificio que quitó nuestros pecados. Tratemos de aceptar y amar a los demás, comenzando por nuestros propios familiares y luego, los demás. Hagamos un esfuerzo para ofrecer nuestra misericordia por todos ellos diariamente. Seremos capaces de hacer eso si somos capaces de sacrificar nuestro ego y convertirnos en una expresión del amor de Jesús. Su amor por nosotros es incondicional. ¿Cuántas veces hemos dicho: te amaré, si haces esto o aquello por mí. Te perdonaré si te comportas de esta u otra manera. El sufrimiento siempre está involucrado en la manifestación del amor. No podemos amar a los demás si realmente nos negamos a perdonarlos. Tenemos que estar preparados para aceptar a los demás tal como son. A veces las personas se sienten mal porque fueron lastimadas y, por lo tanto, no perdonan. Recordemos que el perdón se trata de la falta de sentimientos negativos. Se trata de una decisión de perdonar.

Quizás debemos recordar darnos una oportunidad el uno al otro. ¿Con qué frecuencia tenemos que perdonar? Cuando Pedro se acercó a Jesús para preguntarle: "Señor, ¿cuántas veces debo perdonar a mi hermano si me hace daño? ¿Hasta siete veces? "No siete, te digo, sino setenta y siete veces", quiso decir siempre. ¿Hay algún miembro de tu comunidad que espera que le perdone? ¿Hay personas en nuestras familias que están viviendo una vida miserable porque hemos decidido no perdonarlas? ¿Hay alguien a tu alcance que pueda ser liberado por tus palabras sanadoras, "Te perdono"? Oremos por nuestra disponibilidad para nuestro perdón por todos aquellos que nos hieren.

The Safety Team has been working hard to keep everybody safe for almost six months now. As time goes on it has become very clear we need more volunteers. The current volunteers are working almost every weekend and they need a break.

We need at least 10 more volunteers to staff this ministry properly. Please consider volunteering. It involves working an additional hour on either Saturday evening or Sunday morning/evening.

“The tasks are not involved and are in a written procedure so you know what is involved.” Essentially you need to observe and report. Some contact with the public, saying hello, smiling or asking a few questions if the person seems out of place, and checking some doors.

Are you a Trained Medical Professional Who Could Assist in an Emergency?

In an ongoing effort to make St. James a safe and welcoming community, we have decided to compile a list of all medical folks who attend St. James. This list will assist the security team in the event of a medical emergency.

A part of our parishioners, are getting older and we want to make sure we can assist them if they need us. As we all know accidents do happen.

Phoenix Fire will be called if something happens, but we need to account for a response time.

So, if you wish to be on the list just stop by the office and leave your name, medical profession and the mass you normally attend. When you come Mass just let the hospitality person with the radio earpiece you are there.

Thank you for assisting in this ministry to keep everybody safe here at St. James.

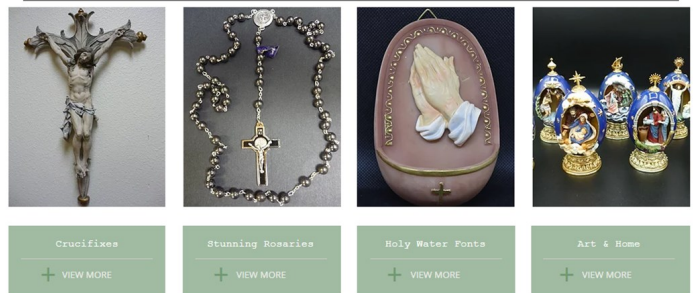
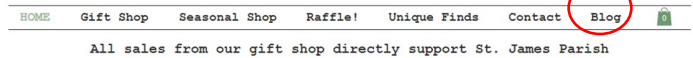

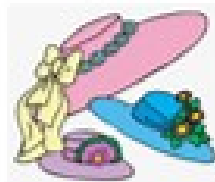
