# Confirmation



This list will assist the security team in the event of a medical emergency. A part of our parishioners, are getting older and we want to make sure we can assist them if they need us. As we all know accidents do happen.

Phoenix Fire will be called if something happens, but we need to account for a response time.

So, if you wish to be on the list just stop by the office and leave your name, medical profession and the mass you normally attend. When you come Mass just let the hospitality person with the radio earpiece you are there. Thank you for assisting in this ministry to keep everybody safe here at St. James.

# Father Henry Roman Wasielewski Jr. (1930-2023)

Catholic Priest, Educator, Social Justice Activist, Prison Chaplain and Square Dance Teacher

Father Henry Roman Wasielewski Jr. was born in Phoenix Arizona on February 21, 1930 to Henry Roman Wasielewski Sr. (1898-1982) and Mary Marguerite Matthews Wasielewski (1902-1964). He was the eldest of three children: brother John Paul Wasielewski (1932-2021) and sister Catharine Sheil Wasielewski Bush (1935-2001). He is survived by five nephews and nieces: Lynn Wasielewski Derrick, Dawn Wasielewski,

Kevin Bush, Michele Bush Pruett and Daniel Bush.

Henry attended St. Mary's Catholic High School in Phoenix, and studied engineering, TV production, journalism, and education at Arizona State College (now Arizona State University). He taught at St. Mary's and ASU before entering the seminary. He was ordained by the Diocese of Tucson during a Pontifical Mass at St. Agnes Parish on June 6, 1964.

Before entering the seminary, Henry was a local celebrity hosting a square-dancing TV show, coaching competitive youth dancing teams, hosting local dancing events with as many as 400 participants, and recording square dance albums under the name Henry Knight. He continued to promote the enjoyment of dancing throughout his life at community, youth, and senior centers in the Phoenix area.

Always a champion for the underprivileged, Henry started his community service by promoting and championing the needs of the Pascua Yaqui Tribe in Guadalupe. Fluent in Spanish and English, Henry was always interested in social justice and would request assignments in underserved and often overlooked communities. He was a champion for migrant workers, working closely with Cesar Chavez. After that, he spent six years as a fulltime chaplain for the Arizona Department of Corrections, counseling inmates both during and after their incarceration. Father Henry established the Diocese's first ministries for both farm workers and prison inmates during these year, and in 1973 established the St. Martin de Porres Parish in Phoenix.

Henry was also a notable nationwide consumer advocate fighting abuse tactics by large funeral services companies. He was a featured expert in many different media outlets including Nightline, The Today Show, Focus on the Family, Newsweek, U.S. News & World Report, Consumers Digest, the Catholic Reporter, and Episcopalian Life. He was also a guest for many local TV stations in various US cities, England, and New Zealand. He was even asked to testify in front the U.S. Senate Health Subcommittee in 2000 and 2002 as he pushed for legislation to make funeral home pricing fair and transparent.

Later in life, Henry turned his focus to promoting the mysteries of Mexico's Lady of Guadalupe painting and in educating communities throughout the U.S. on the significance of and meaning of the Catholic mass. He continued to teach square dancing, provide marriage, substance abuse, grief and senior counseling, and conduct masses in English and Spanish throughout the Valley until his passing on July 19, 2023 at the admirable age of 93.

As Henry now joins Jesus in heaven, please join us in celebrating his many accomplishments and dedicated service to so many during his rich life. He'll be dearly missed, but we are happy for him!
