Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three

But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing.

But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: El celo de tu casa me devora.

Después intervinieron los judíos para preguntarle: "¿Qué señal nos das de que tienes autoridad para actuar así?" Jesús les respondió: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo reconstruiré". Replicaron los judíos: "Cuarenta y seis años se ha llevado la construcción del templo, ¿y tú lo vas a levantar en tres días?"

Pero él hablaba del templo de su cuerpo. Por eso, cuando resucitó Jesús de entre los muertos, se acordaron sus discípulos de que había dicho aquello y creyeron en la Escritura y en las palabras que Jesús había dicho. Mientras estuvo en Jerusalén para las fiestas de Pascua, muchos creyeron en él, al ver los prodigios que hacía. Pero Jesús no se fiaba de ellos, porque los conocía a todos y no necesitaba que nadie le descubriera lo que es el hombre, porque él sabía lo que hay en el hombre.

Twice each year – during Advent and Lent – the St. James community provides tremendous support for a service project to help others who are in critical need. While we usually collect household or personal care items that are distributed locally, this year's project is a little different. We are collecting funds to help school-age girls in Father Ben's village at the Zeu Primary School to acquire much-needed feminine hygiene products. Often, these girls do not attend school during their menstrual cycle due to a lack of crucial sanitary products and menstrual education.

By collaborating with a liaison in Uganda, specifically the school's Senior Woman Teacher, who plays a pivotal role in educating the girls about their menstrual cycle and promoting menstrual health, the project aims to address not just the immediate need for sanitary products but also to provide essential education on menstrual health.

Zeu Primary School is a government school that is Catholic founded. Given the societal challenges faced by many young girls in Uganda, such as limited access to education beyond a certain grade and the prevalence of early marriages, initiatives like this become even more critical in empowering girls to break the cycle of poverty and inequality.

Providing support through financial donations enables the procurement and distribution of necessary hygiene products, ensuring that these girls can attend school consistently and participate fully in their education, regardless of their menstrual cycle.

To contribute to this cause, envelopes are available in the pews, and donations can also be made conveniently through our Online Giving* platform or via the Online Giving QR code. The project will run through Palm Sunday, offering an extended opportunity for individuals to contribute and make a meaningful impact on the lives of these young girls.

The St. James community's ongoing dedication to supporting those in need reflects the spirit of compassion and generosity, and every contribution towards this cause is a step towards promoting equality, health, and education for all.

St. James Parishioners, your generosity continues to overwhelm us. Your kindness the first week of the Lenten Service Project has far exceeded our hopes. Thank you!


