Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel - Mk 10:17-30

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: *You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother.*" He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

Evangelio - Mc 10, 17-30

En aquel tiempo, cuando salía Jesús al camino, se le acercó corriendo un hombre, se arrodilló ante él y le preguntó: "Maestro bueno, ¿qué debo hacer para alcanzar la vida eterna?" Jesús le contestó: "¿Por qué me llamas bueno? Nadie es bueno sino sólo Dios. Ya sabes los mandamientos: *No matarás, no cometerás adulterio, no robarás, no levantarás falso testimonio, no cometerás fraudes, honrarás a tu padre y a tu madre*".

Entonces él le contestó: "Maestro, todo eso lo he cumplido desde muy joven". Jesús lo miró con amor y le dijo: "Sólo una cosa te falta: Ve y vende lo que tienes, da el dinero a los pobres y así tendrás un tesoro en los cielos. Después, ven y sígueme". Pero al oír estas palabras, el hombre se entristeció y se fue apesadumbrado, porque tenía muchos bienes.

Jesús, mirando a su alrededor, dijo entonces a sus discípulos: "¡Qué difícil les va a ser a los ricos entrar en el Reino de Dios!" Los discípulos quedaron sorprendidos ante estas palabras; pero Jesús insistió: "Hijitos, ¡qué difícil es para los que confían en las riquezas, entrar en el Reino de Dios! Más fácil le es a un camello pasar por el ojo de una aguja, que a un rico entrar en el Reino de Dios".

Ellos se asombraron todavía más y comentaban entre sí: "Entonces, ¿quién puede salvarse?" Jesús, mirándolos fijamente, les dijo: "Es imposible para los hombres, mas no para Dios. Para Dios todo es posible".

Entonces Pedro le dijo a Jesús: "Señor, ya ves que nosotros lo hemos dejado todo para seguirte".

Jesús le respondió: "Yo les aseguro: Nadie que haya dejado casa, o hermanos o hermanas, o padre o madre, o hijos o tierras, por mí y por el Evangelio, dejará de recibir, en esta vida, el ciento por uno en casas, hermanos, hermanas, madres, hijos y tierras, junto con persecuciones, y en el otro mundo, la vida eterna".

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS OF 28TH SUNDAY YEAR B.

All human beings have desire for success in our lives. Everyone strives in different ways to find happiness in life. We work so hard to earn more. For instance a businessman looks for various methods to increase his business and finally increase his income; the farmer also does his farming with skills and great effort to get more crops and finally his income increases. Indeed, this way goes with God's command to man since creation: "*Be fruitful, multiply, fill the earth and subdue it.*" (Genesis 1:28) So, having wealth or having power or being famous because of your talents is not a bad thing. They are gifts we receive from God for the ongoing work of creation. From that order of God, man should see the connection between the work of his hands and the presence of God. So, all the success he gets should be connected to his great wisdom. God is the reason for the existence of all things and from Him we draw wisdom. Today the word of God reminds us of the wealth of God's wisdom. The first reading begins by instructing us that, to be wise, we should pray to God because He is the origin of wisdom. "*All wisdom comes from God...*" (Sirach 1:1). That wisdom is the light to guide us in being able to use this world well.

No creature, nor even kings, can acquire this wisdom. Therefore, the first thing we owe is closeness to God through faith. King Solomon is an example for us. He prayed saying: "*Give me your servant a moral heart to judge your people and distinguish between good and bad*" (1 Kings 3:6-9). That should be the desire for man. Wealth of any kind, all beauty, and good health is nothing if one lacks God's wisdom. This is because his lights never fade. Each of us in life is called to evaluate what is valuable. Is it just to accumulate wealth and power without being wise? As the author of the first reading says, that wisdom is light and permanent. It is the light to guide us well to achieve true success.

From the Gospel story, the young man's desire introduces us to the wealth of God's wisdom. The young man is running to Christ. This act shows a man's confidence in his abilities. These habits that are practiced more in our youth today. Adolescence is over decorated with over confidence and seeing that everything is possible in the person's abilities. That is why we see this young man praising himself before Christ. That he knows the commandments and has kept them, what will prevent him from inheriting the kingdom of heaven? It is as if he defines himself as perfect and eventually justifying himself. He can do it all because he has the ability. But the end of it all, we are told that the young man "*turned his face... and went sadly*". This prompts us to reflect on what caused the bitter and sad end. Despite being strong as a young man, despite having a lot of wealth, despite assuming that he has kept well the commandments of God, he ended up in sorrow.

The sadness was caused by Christ's desire for him to use his wealth and share it with others. Christ revealed to him how God's wisdom leads to perfection. In other words, he invited the young man to learn from the life of Christ how to be good. Christ in his human form showed how man becomes good before God. The goodness aligns our lives with God and thus makes God continue to flow from our lives. When this young man called Christ "*Good Teacher*" he undoubtedly saw him and therefore wanted to imitate him in that goodness. God's wisdom reveals itself in Christ and leads us to goodness and wants us to unify this world according to God's will. This is the state of intending to do everything to see and taste God's love. So, when we are directed to that wisdom we should see happiness.

REFLEXIÓN SOBRE LAS LECTURAS DEL DOMINGO 28 AÑO B.

Todos los seres humanos tenemos deseos de éxito en nuestras vidas. Cada uno se esfuerza de diferentes maneras por encontrar la felicidad en la vida. Trabajamos muy duro para ganar más. Por ejemplo, un hombre de negocios busca varios métodos para incrementar su negocio y finalmente aumentar sus ingresos; el agricultor también cultiva con habilidades y gran esfuerzo para obtener más cultivos y finalmente sus ingresos aumentan. De hecho, este camino va con el mandato de Dios al hombre desde la creación: *“Sean fecundos y multiplíquense. Llenen la tierra y sométanla.”* (Génesis 1:28) Por lo tanto, tener riquezas o tener poder o ser famoso debido a tus talentos no es algo malo. Son regalos que recibimos de Dios para el trabajo continuo de la creación. Desde ese orden de Dios, el hombre debe ver la conexión entre la obra de sus manos y la presencia de Dios. Entonces, todo el éxito que obtenga debe estar relacionado con su gran sabiduría. Dios es la razón de la existencia de todas las cosas y de Él obtenemos la sabiduría. Hoy la palabra de Dios nos recuerda la riqueza de la sabiduría de Dios. La primera lectura comienza instruyéndonos que, para ser sabios, debemos orar a Dios porque Él es el origen de la sabiduría. *“Toda sabiduría viene de Dios...”* (Eclesiástico 1:1). Esa sabiduría es la luz que nos guiará para poder utilizar bien este mundo.

Ninguna criatura, ni siquiera los reyes, puede adquirir esta sabiduría. Por tanto, lo primero que debemos es la cercanía a Dios a través de la fe. El rey Salomón es un ejemplo para nosotros. Oró diciendo: *“Dale a tu siervo un corazón moral para juzgar a tu pueblo y distinguir entre el bien y el mal”* (1 Reyes 3:6-9). Ese debería ser el deseo del hombre. La riqueza de cualquier tipo, toda la belleza y la buena salud no son nada si uno carece de la sabiduría de Dios. Esto se debe a que sus luces nunca se apagan. Cada uno de nosotros en la vida está llamado a evaluar lo que es valioso. ¿Es justo acumular riqueza y poder sin ser sabio? Como dice el autor de la primera lectura, esa sabiduría es ligera y permanente. Es la luz que nos guiará bien para alcanzar el verdadero éxito.

A partir del relato evangélico, el deseo del joven nos introduce en la riqueza de la sabiduría de Dios. El joven corre hacia Cristo. Este acto muestra la confianza de un hombre en sus habilidades. Estos hábitos que se practican más en nuestra juventud hoy en día. La adolescencia está decorada con un exceso de confianza y de ver que todo es posible en las capacidades de la persona. Por eso vemos a este joven alabarse ante Cristo. Que conozca los mandamientos y los haya guardado, ¿qué le impedirá heredar el reino de los cielos? Es como si se definiera a sí mismo como perfecto y eventualmente se justificara. Puede hacerlo todo porque tiene la capacidad. Pero al final de todo, nos cuentan que el joven *“volvió la cara... y se fue triste”*. Esto nos lleva a reflexionar sobre lo que provocó el amargo y triste final. A pesar de ser fuerte de joven, a pesar de tener muchas riquezas, a pesar de suponer que ha guardado bien los mandamientos de Dios, acabó en el dolor.
